Applications are invited for a five year .5 FTE position at the lecturer level commencing July 1, 2017.

JOB DESCRIPTION

The position is responsible for the creation and coordination of clinical education experiences for graduate students in the Audiology program. The Academic Coordinator will teach a half-credit course on clinical methods, hold group and individual meetings with students preparing for practica, and train/mentor clinical educators. The position provides direct supervision of audiology students in their first exposure to clinical education in the Dalhousie Audiology Clinic. Teaching of a topic module in an academic audiology course may be required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must hold a Master's degree in Audiology and be eligible for membership/certification by Speech-Language & Audiology Canada (SAC). A minimum of 3 years clinical experience including student supervision is required. The successful candidate will have strong interpersonal, organizational, and teamwork skills. A doctorate of audiology (AuD) degree and university teaching experience are assets.

Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience. This appointment is subject to budgetary approval.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. Dalhousie University is committed to fostering a collegial culture grounded in diversity and inclusiveness. The university encourages applications from Aboriginal people, persons with a disability, racially visible persons, women, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and all candidates who would contribute to the diversity of our community.
