JOB FUNCTIONS:

Administers Diagnostic Tests

- Conducts thorough audiometric assessments following best audiological practices.
- Performs all standard test measures as well as speech in noise assessments and tinnitus assessments.
- Interprets test results and provides reporting to physicians and other medical professionals.

Manages Hearing Rehabilitation

- Counsels patients, following practice protocols, in a caring and respectful manner regarding test
 results, making recommendations regarding hearing care options. Reviews treatment options
 available to improve hearing loss.
- Performs selection, programming, and verification of the appropriate hearing aid technology to best meet the patient's individual needs.
- Provides ongoing management including follow-up and education, hearing aid checks and adjustments, repairs, and cleanings as necessary to maintain ongoing patient relationships.
- Uses software to record every patient interaction and financial transaction.
- Performs cerumen management utilizing irrigation, suction and/or instrumentation techniques when required.



Assists in Professional and Community Outreach

In addition to professional responsibilities, the clinician will be part of a team engaging in fundraising, marketing outreach and growing positive relationships with colleagues, vendors, fellow healthcare practitioners, and community organizations. This includes informational presentations regarding hearing loss, treatment options, and technology to local community groups, facilities, and medical professionals.
