Salima Jiwani (Ph.D.) is the founder/president and lead audiologist at AudioSense, a Hearing and Balance clinic located in Yorkville, Toronto. She is also an Adjunct Professor in the department of Speech-Language Pathology, Department of Rehabilitation at the University of Toronto and Clinical Instructor with the Distance Education program at Salus University.

She earned her Ph.D. in Auditory Neurophysiology, Cochlear Implants and Neuroscience with the Institute of Medical Science at the University of Toronto in 2014. She completed her Doctoral work at the Cochlear Implant Laboratory at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto where she worked with children and adolescents who are deaf and have used a cochlear implant to hear for most of their lives.



Salima is an advocate for the profession of audiology as Past-President of AA and former chair of the Science and Education committee. In these roles, she encouraged clinical research in the field of audiology to elevate our profession, give audiologists a voice, and promote optimal audiological health care for all her patients.


