

Grow your Audiology career at Health Sciences Centre (HSC) Winnipeg!

We offer a dynamic team-oriented environment for working, learning and conducting research. More than 8,000 staff, physicians and volunteers care for patients on our site. Highly-skilled interdisciplinary teams provide complex, specialty acute care, including diagnostics, as well as outpatient and inpatient services for adults and children from across Manitoba, North-Western Ontario and Nunavut.

HSC is a Shared Health facility and is Manitoba's provincial tertiary center for trauma, transplants, burns, neurosciences, complex cancer care and pediatric care. Every clinical hospital-based service available in the province is offered at HSC, with the exception of cardiac surgery and eye surgery. This means the majority of Manitobans' tertiary care is provided here, regardless of which community our patients call home.

At HSC you will be welcomed into a strong community of staff who care for and support each other. Your professional development and well-being will be supported through staff wellness and appreciation programs and education and training opportunities.

Position Overview

Our clinic population includes ENT patients, inpatients, Cancer Care patients, second opinion requests from the community audiologists, sedated ABRs, UNHS diagnostics and Surveillance follow up.

We provide audiology services consistent with discipline and professional standards including:

- Assessment of hearing including evaluation, diagnosis, and counselling.
- Select and perform appropriate test measures for a pediatric population, including ABR, behavioral observation audiometry, visual reinforcement audiometry and conditioned play audiometry. We offer an array of testing strategies for a difficult to test population.
- Select and perform appropriate test measures in an adult population with complex otological issues.
- Consultation with clients and referral to other professionals.
- Clinical supervision and training of Audiology students and provisional members of CASLPM.
- Participate in the education of other healthcare professionals, including ENT Residents.
- Provide education and guidance to other healthcare providers and individuals/ professionals working within the healthcare system.

Education

- Master's degree or higher in Audiology from an accredited/ recognized university is required.
- Ongoing participation in relevant courses, workshops, and online presentations to meet the continuing education requirements of CASLPM.

Certification/Licensure/Registration

- Must be registered with the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Manitoba (CASLPM). Membership in other professional organizations is encouraged; for example, the Canadian Academy of Audiology (CAA) and Speech-Language and Audiology Canada (SAC).

All positions require a current satisfactory Criminal Records Check (including Vulnerable Sector Search), Child Abuse Registry Check and Adult Abuse Registry Check as conditions of employment. The successful candidate will be responsible for any service charges incurred. A security check is considered current if it was obtained no more than six (6) months prior to the start of employment.
