The role is mainly based at Hutt Hospital alongside our Newborn hearing screening team and ENT service, and also involves an outreach service in Masterton. We offer a full range of services including electrophysiological assessments, paediatric/adult diagnostics and habilitation (including Bone Anchored/Conduction Hearing Aids), APD assessments and diagnostic assessments for ENT clinics. With a wide range of services, collaborative team environment and a depth of experience to support you in your learning this role is the perfect start to your Audiology career. The successful applicant will have both a paediatric and adult diagnostic and habilitation caseload and full supervision for completion of the NZAS Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCCs) and NZAS Paediatric Certificates will be provided.
