- Current ACSLPA registration, or eligibility to register;
- Recent experience in conducting full pediatric diagnostic audiometric assessments and/or pediatric hearing aid fittings;
- Recent experience conducting diagnostic audiometric assessments and interpretation;
- Experience with specialized testing, such as: auditory brainstem response testing, tinnitus measurement and management, vestibular assessments, and central auditory screening will be considered an asset.
