The Central Speech and Hearing Clinic is a not-for-profit organization that supports children and adults who are deaf or hard of hearing. The clinic provides family-based listening and spoken language intervention to children and audiology services to children and adults who use hearing aids, bone-anchored hearing aids and cochlear implants. We are searching for a dedicated audiologist with experience in cochlear implant management to work alongside our intervention team to provide audiology support to our patients.

PURPOSE:

- Administer cochlear implant candidacy assessments for children & adults.
- Provide audiological services to children & adults with hearing loss as part of the cochlear implant program.
- Provide audiological support & maintenance to children & adults with hearing aids, bone-anchored hearing aids & cochlear implants. Tasks may include but are not limited to administrative duties, equipment troubleshooting, hearing assessments & hearing aid dispensing.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Master's degree in Audiology.
- Current registration & certification with the College of Audiologists and Speech Language Pathologists of Manitoba (CASLPM).
- Minimum 2 years of clinical experience related to cochlear implant management, evaluations, programming & troubleshooting.
- Demonstrated experience (or willingness to learn) in the delivery of audiological services to children & adults with hearing loss.
- Current advanced competency certification in cochlear implant management or equivalent.
- Commitment to expand knowledge and experience in the field of cochlear implant technology & listening and spoken language therapy.

- Ability to work independently & collaboratively as part of an interdisciplinary team.

- Assist in the development and purchase of audiological equipment and materials.
- Provide training, mentorship and resources to students.
